Angela Biedenbender, pianist, educator, and collaborator, has performed with choral ensembles, vocalists, and instrumentalists in the U.S. and Europe. An experienced educator, she has presented her research on the ways children learn music at the Michigan Music Conference and the Detroit Orff Schulwerk Association. She holds degrees in music from the University of Michigan and Central Michigan University. In her East Lansing community, she teaches music at Glencairn School.

Pat Harris is a bassist, songwriter, and composer with musical roots in classical, jazz, and American traditions.
